Introduction:

To help us get excited for our learning in September, the year 1 team have come up with some ideas that you might find enjoyable and educational. Feel free to change them to meet the needs of your child and relate them to their context I.e. think about the jobs of your people within your wider social circle, within your community and the buildings where people do their jobs in close proximity to your home.









Project and Activity Ideas

Ideas for projects:

Key Workers- During the Corona Virus pandemic the term 'key or vital worker' became widely used. Do you know what a key worker is? What jobs do they do? Think about why these jobs are so important to the running of our country. **ACTIVITY**: Write a thank you letter to a key worker.

Jobs and workplaces – How many jobs can you think of? Now match these jobs to their workplace. For example, nurse = hospital and firefighter = fire station and various locations where the emergencies occur.

ACTIVITY: Create a card game where you have to match the card with the workplace and then get your sibling or parent to play. This could be drawn and elaborated by making a third set of cards for the objects that the profession uses.

ACTIVITY: Role play! Dress up as e.g. a nurse or a postman and pretend to be them! Write down all the activities you do in that role.





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
ACTIVITY: Interview people you know with jobs and ask them why they like their job.

ACTIVITY: Eye Spy jobs- when you go for a walk, how many people can you spot who are performing their jobs?

Questions to Research

- How do you become an astronaut (or whatever job you would like to have when you are older)?
- What age can you get your first job?
- How long do you need to study to become a vet (or whatever job you would like to have when you are older)?
- What jobs did people have in the U.K. in the past?
- What jobs do the people in your family have?
- How do you get a job?
- How have jobs changed over time? (eg, how is nursing different now to 100 years ago?)
- How do jobs differ around the world? (eg, how are fire engines different in the UK to another country?)
