Ideas for projects

5. Decorate pottery in the Ancient Greek style.

7. Build a miniature Ancient Greek temple.
8. Write a day-in-the-life story from the perspective of an Ancient Greek.

2. What was life like in Ancient Greece?
3. What kind of food did they eat in Ancient Greece?
4. What beliefs did the Ancient Greeks have?
5. How do we know about the Ancient Greeks?
6. How did the Ancient Greeks change the world?
